

Tailored to Local Context



Integrated Student Supports

(e.g. address well being through medical, dental, mental health, housing, nutrition, transportation, criminal justice)



Expanded and Enriched Learning Time

(e.g. before and after school, weekend, summer academic, enrichment, projectbased learning)



Active Family and Community Engagement

(e.g. centralized resources and educational opportunities for families)

What is Restorative Practice?

- Strategies to build community and promote a positive school climate
- Develop emotional literacy, accountability, empathy, and strong sense of community and safety
- Framework to guide relationships and accountability between all staff, students, and families

The Restorative Process

- Student Statements (giving students voice)
 - What happened?
 - How did this make you feel?
 - Who has been affected by what happened? In what way?
 - What do you need to do in order to make things right?
- Restorative Conferences (all voices are included in a collaborative conversation)
 - What happened? (from each participant)
 - How did this make you feel?
 - What can we agree on moving forward?
- Re-Entry into the Community (when returning from out-of-school suspension)
 - What have you thought about since?
 - Is there anything that still needs to happen to make this right?
 - What's the hardest thing for you now that you are returning to school?
 - What support do you need?
 - How can I help you?

ROSCCO After School Enrichment for Middle School

As the middle school director for ROSCCO, I oversee afterschool enrichment for two middle schools in Stamford, Connecticut. My team and I provides enriching activities for over 300 students, including Mandarin, sign language, Italian, art/sketching, film, STEM engineering club, drones, hair/makeup, cooking lessons, sports, and field trips. We also teach entrepreneurship skills, stock market basics, and how to trade and more.

We welcome the opportunity to apply the same method within Dolan and Rippowam.

After school enrichment is important for middle school students because it helps them develop new skills and interests, and it encourages them to set and achieve their goals. After school enrichment also provides an opportunity for them to develop relationships with peers and adults, and it allows them to form a positive view of themselves.
